Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

Just Thinkin' ...About Why We Baptist Infants!

Demographically speaking, the Volunteer state has been known for some time as not only part of the "Bible Belt", but its very buckle. At one time it seemed Tennessee had more churches (as my mother would say), than "Carter has little liver pills"! When I first began in the ministry I once serve a Methodist church in a community of 1,400 people...that had 14 churches! There, when a person left their church they didn't go to a different one, they started their own!

Another characteristic of the church in the Bible Belt is its view on baptism. By and large, it holds to what is called "believer's baptism" simply meaning the prerequisite for baptism is based on the stated belief/feelings of the person seeking to be baptized. This often results in individuals requesting to be re-baptized, often more than once. It also raises questions regarding the power of baptism and its efficacy. Why should one's baptism need to be re-done? Did it not take? Did God make a mistake? In the United Methodist Church, especially in small rural congregations, "believer's baptism" is widely practiced; often as a result of revival services where adults have accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior.

But we Methodists also baptize infants! Because the practice of "believer's baptism" is so deeply rooted in this part of the country, a good many find this a difficult practice to accept; so terms like "dedication" and "christening" are used to make it more acceptable, when in fact it is neither! It is the initial sacrament in the United Methodist Church. As such, a sacrament is defined as, "an outward and visible sign of an inward and visible grace, signifying to others the change that has been wrought in the life of the believer." The difference is simply this. In "believer's baptism" the emphasis is placed on the feelings of the individual; whereas in infant baptism the emphasis is shifted to God and what God is doing in the infant's life as a work of grace. We call that Prevenient grace, which is the unmerited favor of God present in our lives before we are aware of it. Some suggest that by administering this sacrament the infant is being denied the opportunity to accept Christ as their Lord and Savior. This is simply not so! Each baptized infant has the opportunity to grow and mature in their faith and to accept a personal relationship with Christ, either before or when they are confirmed (*which is the act of making firm in their lives the faith into which they have been baptized*).

I don't know about you, but I'm so very thankful that God's activity and love in our lives is not contingent upon our awareness or understanding of it, or how I may feel about it! I'm grateful that God just "goes ahead and loves us" without our permission our understanding! It is in infant baptism that we acknowledge what God is doing and give thanks.

Additionally, along with the child's parents and family, we as the congregation commit ourselves to live before the child a life that bears witness to the life of Jesus, in the sure and certain hope that as the child watches us live out our faith, they will come to the place where they will say... "if that's what it means to be Christian, I want Christ as my Savior!" In doing this, they are responding to the active grace of God that's been at work within them all along! A decision for Christ is never denied an individual!



We had the honor this past Sunday morning of sharing in the baptism of *George Thomas Joiner*. We recognized and gave thanks for God's activity already begun in his life, his parents promised to bring him up in the family of faith, to expose him to the gospel in various ways, and we as a congregation agreed to live in relationship to one another in such a way that not only George, but all of our children will one day say for themselves, "the Jesus you have shown me is the Jesus I want to accept as my Lord." Our prayer for all of our children is that they never forget "who" they are (*baptized children of God*) and "whose" they are (*they belong to God*).

If your child or children have not yet been baptized, I'd like for us to talk and then schedule a Sunday when we together can celebrate what God is already doing in their life!

Why some folk believe the faith is all about the individual, and others understand the faith always begins with God's activity is worth thinkin' about.

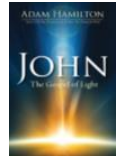

MASON'S MOMENTS

Can I Have Peace

To the students, and to the parents that so lovingly raise them, we need to address something. We refuse to be still. I think many times we refuse to let peace wash over us, and I think that's stopping something special from happening.

I know it sounds out there, but hear this: "Be still, and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10). When I saw this verse growing up, it seemed to be something that my parents were paraphrasing ("Be still, Mason! God didn't make you to be noisy!") Close, right? The answer's no. When I see this now, this verse makes sense. I have packed my life so full of different organizations, work, and anything else that will fit in 24 hours that I feel like my life doesn't actually stop. You may relate. Youth today are rushed on an unreal level. We're involved in more things, we're chasing bigger dreams, and altogether we are begging for a way to slow things down. Parents, you're stuck chasing your youth around. But God did not create us to struggle with this anxiety or stress for the sake of itself. He created us to be breathing Him in. He created us to be a part of His kingdom, and that isn't made to stress us out. Consider trying this: Every single day, take a breath. Go somewhere where no one else can hear you, and you can only mildly hear everything else, and breathe. Take in the silence, and take in the fact that God is still God, and He's still holding you close. Just be still.
